Fleece tape, width 52 mm, made of fibreglass. Modular product belonging to the accessories category.

## INTENDED USE

Designated for reinforcing joints of gypsum plasterboards in indoor plasterboard lining systems. Recommended for tapered (longitudinal) and butt (transverse) joints. The tape should be melted into the construction compound, being a part of the system, previously applied to the joint. New fiber tape that fits DELKO HYBRID devices.
